Content Module Information

You should start each content module by clicking the appropriate link on the left side of the course homepage in Blackboard. Although the Introductory and Synthesis Modules have a different layout, the three content modules will follow this progression.

- Week 1 of Module Read the introduction: The introduction is intended to frame your thinking about the content in the module. Begin by considering the questions provided to guide your reflection about your own experiences. Take the survey to share your thinking with the class.
- Week 2 of Module Reviewing Readings and Artifacts: Within each module, each group will be assigned to a different topic. During Week 2, you will have a chance to review the artifacts connected with your topic. Then, along with group members, you will create a Wiki of the main points and supporting research. Because each member will need to contribute at least 5 points, you will want to make note of meaningful quotes and other big ideas as you read/view.
- Week 3 of Module Create a Presentation for the Class: Based on the list of main points your group develops in the Wiki, your group will work together to create a presentation for the class on your topic. For each module, you will be using a different presentation style, so please make sure to read instructions for this section carefully. For your presentation, you will also need to create a viewing test that will be completed by your fellow class members.
- Week 4 of Module -- Module Synthesis: At the end of each module, you will view the other presentations in your section in order to learn more about all of the topics in the module. After viewing the presentations, each student will complete a "Module Presentation Test" compiled of questions created by each group. In addition, there will also be a synthesis question created by me that asks you to reflect on the module as a whole.
